Degree revision: Bachelor of Architecture

Clarified and simplified the undergraduate architectural history requirement from five alternate paths to a single path. All undergraduate students will be required to take ARH 314 and ARH 315, plus two upper division architectural history electives. No change in the number of required credits of architectural history.

Degree revision: BA in Art History

Added residency requirement for BA in Art History. At least 4 of 8 required upper-division courses must be taken at the UO.

Planning, Public Policy and Management

Degree revision: Master of Nonprofit Management

Remove one core course (PPPM 526 Strategic Planning, 4 cr); add one core course (PPPM 610 Research Skills, 2 cr); replace PPPM 684 Public and Nonprofit Financial Management with PPPM 683 Nonprofit Financial Management. Changes reduce degree requirements from 72 to 70 credits. Approved by Graduate Council, UO Senate

School of Art + Design

UO Degree revision: Minimum requirement for BFA

Reduce minimum requirements for the BFA to a four-year, 180-credit degree, in line with peer BFA degrees, and in line with the UO Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Education.
